- 3) 1801 Rainier project. Seattle
- 4) Saltwood Project, Portland
- 5) Nishioka Building project. Salem.

Pursuant to Governor Inslee's stay-at-home order:

Under the Order "construction workers who support ... construction sites and construction projects (including housing construction)" are listed as an "essential service."

Based upon this language, homebuilders and remodelers may continue with operations while the stayat-home order is in effect. *Pacific Wall Systems* is engaged in the construction of emergency & crisis housing along with other multi-family housing operations effected by the homeless crisis in the Puget Sound.

In order to protect yourself and those around you, you are required to adhere to the following jobsite quidelines and hygiene precautions:

- 1. Continue social distancing of six feet
- 2. Wash hands frequently and do not touch your face
- 3. Wear gloves on jobsite
